Scottsdale Saguaro High School's 6-foot-5, 185-pound senior forward **Steven Morin** is fresh off an amazing 58-point performance in a 101-63 blowout victory over Canyon del Oro HS.

While unranked Saguaro HS has started this year's high school basketball season off to a slow start (2-4), with all four of their losses coming at this year's *Salpointe Tip-Off Classic*, Morin has been on fire on the season. Morin's most recent 58-point splash showcased his versatility as a player and a wide variety of offensive skills.

While Morin is among the state's most versatile wing prospects in the 2009 class, the scholarship offers have not poured in for this talented performer. That is as of yet. Still an unsigned senior prospect, such a recent scoring outburst as Morin turned in will definitely have division-I college coaches taking notice this winter and spring.

As a college prospect, Morin is a good looking one. A taller wing prospect that possesses a long, rangy body, Morin is your prototypical looking wing prospect for the division-I level. He is a very good half-court performer that is able to score with the basketball in his hands or while slashing for scoring opportunities to the basket. He is also a good open court player and finisher in the open floor, where he thrives.

Morin has really developed as a shooter over the past two years as well, and is now capable of shooting effectively from three point range or from mid-range off the dribble. Long hours of working hard on his game and skill level have paid off for Morin, who was once just an athletic talent.

Morin's length of body and superb athleticism also allow for him to be a very good rebounder, especially on the offensive end of the floor where he gains good inside position and is active around the glass. His physical attributes also allow for him to be a solid defender and a good shotblocker as well.

While Morin remains an unsigned senior prospect at this point in his high school career, he should now become one of the more sought after wing prospects in the state for the late spring signing period, as more schools venture to the state of Arizona this winter
