## **Woods recaps unofficial visit to Colorado**

Both of **Collin Woods'** parents graduated from Colorado and he attended the Buffaloes' Elite Camp last summer. So going into an unofficial visit to Colorado this past week, he knew what to expect in terms of environment and campus life. But it was his first opportunity to meet new head coach **Tad Boyle**.

**Woods currently has the most interest in CU and Arizona State.**

"I got to talk to all of their new coaches, actually," said the 6-foot-2, 165-pound guard from Scottsdale (Ariz.) Horizon. "They definitely know what they are talking about. I like what they are trying to do, what they are trying to build at Colorado in the next few years. It will be pretty interesting to see how they do this season.

"I was also really impressed with the new facilities that they are building and how nice the campus is overall. It is really beautiful with the backdrop of the mountains."

Woods has received scholarship offers from Colorado, Arizona State, Colorado State, Fresno State, San Diego, UTEP and Weber State.

"I am not disregarding any of the schools that have offered me right now but I think ASU and Colorado have really caught my eye the most," he said. "ASU and Colorado are both really good schools."

What has Woods been hearing from the Sun Devils' coaching staff?

"They are saying that I would definitely be a big contributor if I came in there next year so I am definitely considering them," he said. "That would be a great fit with it being my hometown school.

"I hope to make a commitment by the end of the summer but I am not sure. We'll see what happens."

Woods was named first-team all-state and was also the Player of the Year in his region this past season. He averaged 17.5 points, 3.9 rebounds, 3.1 assists and two steals per contest.

"People have compared my style of play to Russell Westbrook and Darren Collison," Woods said. "I'm an athletic combo guard. I feel I am a good defender and I have the ability to create my own shot."

Woods will be playing in the following tournaments with his AAU team this month: Pangos Summer Sweet 16 (Long Beach), Fullcourt Press Cream of the Crop (Long Beach) and Super 64 (Las Vegas).
